 - Easy to challenging **hiking and backpacking trails**

 - The **Kīpahulu District** (the coastal region of the park) offers another assortment of hiking opportunities from a 0.5 mile trail to a 4 mile Bamboo Forest Hike (Pīpīwai Trail) around the 400-foot Waimoku Falls.

- **Ho'okipa Lookout:** On Hana Highway just past Mama's Fish House, this is where the 50-60 foot wave the islanders call "Jaws" visits each winter. A beautiful place to watch great board and kite surfing.
- **Islands of Lanai and Molokai**, which are part of Maui County – these have a charm of their own. Lanai has two Four Seasons Resorts, each with a beautiful golf course. Molokai is more rustic than Maui, with beautiful shorelines and volcanic mountains. There is a hike or mule ride that goes through Kalaupapa National Historical Park, which ends at the historic settlement where Father (now Saint) Damien cared for victims of leprosy.
